# What are the benefits of participating?

When students come together and volunteer together it shows leadership and community building. By getting your students involved at your local high school, it shows that the school is inspiring students to think about going to college or to discover their passion or skills. Not only that, but the high school can be recognized as a foundation for continuous support to the community by the number of volunteer hours their students donate. As for the students, it helps them network with professionals they encounter and to build their resume. It also puts them at the top of the list for college acceptance for the volunteer service they committed to in high school because it shows that they are goal oriented and driven with determination.

### What are the rewards offered to the students?

Students who volunteer 25 or more hours will receive an invitation to the award ceremony held at the Inland Center Mall. Based on the number of hours they volunteered they can receive a certificate, a pin, a service letter for their letterman jacket or a gift card of \$100. The student with the most volunteer hours receives a certificate and a trophy for their hard work. The school with most hours completed receives the trophy that gets passed on each year from school to school for being the top school for volunteer service.

# How to participate?

In order to participate in Teens Make a Difference you have to be a school official at the high school that is looking to participate (teacher, club advisor, etc.). From there fill out the school site coordinator Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) and turn it in to Arrowhead United Way.
